Would you like to improve your financial situation?

Is there something you or your family needs, but it seems like you'll never be able to save enough money?!?!

Saving Circle
can help you save!

HOW DOES THE SAVING CIRCLE PROGRAM WORK?

The Saving Circle Program helps individuals and families living on a low income save for needed assets. Examples of assets that qualify include: education, furniture, computer, eyeglasses, dental or disability supports, housing co-op share. You have up to 6 months to save up to \$250.

For every \$1 you save, Saving Circle will match it with \$3 in credits towards purchasing your asset goal. Maximum combined total is \$1,000.

SUPPORTS TO HELP YOU SAVE

Money Management Training workshops on banking, budgeting, debt, setting savings goals and managing saving problems.

Support from staff to help you reach your financial goals.

WHO CAN APPLY?

To qualify, you must...

- Be at or below the income cut-offs
- Have a strong desire to improve your financial future

WHAT IS THE INCOME CUT-OFF?

Saving Circle is for households who are living on low incomes. You must have a household income that is at or below the program cut-off on the chart below:

Household Size	Saving Circle Program Cut-Off*
1 Person	\$18,450
2 People	\$22,969
3 People	\$28,238
4 People	\$34,284
5 People	\$38,885
6 People	\$43,855
7 People	\$48,826

*Based on 75% of Statistics Canada 2015 low income cut off
